

DALLAS LOVE FIELD (DAL)

Republican National Midterm Convention Prior Permission Required (PPR) Policy

Effective September 8–11, 2026

1. Purpose

Dallas Love Field (DAL) will implement a temporary Prior Permission Required (PPR) policy for general aviation and charter aircraft operations from September 8 through September 11, 2026, in support of the 2026 RNC Midterm Convention. This policy is intended to manage anticipated surge demand on airfield and ramp capacity, coordinate Fixed Base Operator (FBO) parking availability, and support Air Traffic Control (ATC) and U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) planning for the event window.

2. Effective Period

This PPR policy is in effect from 0001 local time September 8, 2026 through 2359 local time September 11, 2026. All arrivals and departures by non-scheduled operators (general aviation, charter, and fractional/private operators) during this window are subject to this policy.

3. Applicability

This policy applies to:

- All general aviation (GA) and charter aircraft arrivals and departures at DAL during the effective period.
- Fractional fleet operators and private operators requesting ramp space at any DAL-based FBO.
- Any operator requesting parking, fuel services, or ground handling from a DAL FBO during the event window.

This policy does not apply to scheduled Part 121 commercial airline operations and JSX flights, which will continue to operate under normal procedures. MEDEVAC flights will not be required to have a PPR.

4. PPR Request Requirement

Effective immediately, all operators intending to land at DAL between September 8–11, 2026 must submit a landing request in advance using the official DAL PPR Microsoft Form. Requests will not be granted through FBOs directly- all requests must go through Airport Operations via phone (214-671-5183) or the form linked below to ensure a single point of coordination across FBOs, ATC, and CBP.

5. Required Information

Operators must provide the following information on the PPR request form:

- Requested arrival date and time (local)
- Requested departure date and time (local), if known
- Preferred/receiving FBO
- Aircraft type and registration (tail number)
- Operator name and point of contact (name, phone, email)
- Purpose of visit, if applicable (e.g., convention-related, media, private travel)
- Clearing Customs? Yes or No.

6. Review and Confirmation Process

1. Operator makes a reservation with their preferred FBO and obtains a reservation number.
2. Operator submits a PPR request by calling 214-671-5183 or via the [Microsoft Form](#).
3. DAL Operations reviews the request against available ramp capacity at the requested FBO and coordinates with the receiving FBO to confirm space.
4. Once reviewed, the operator will receive a confirmation email either approving the requested slot, offering an alternate date/time/FBO, or noting the request is denied due to capacity.
5. Operators should not consider a request confirmed until they receive this confirmation email. Submission of the form alone does not guarantee landing rights.
6. Operators are strongly encouraged to submit requests as early as possible, as FBO ramp space is expected to be constrained during the event window.

7. FBO Coordination

Participating FBOs will receive a consolidated view of approved PPR requests for their facility from DAL Operations. FBOs should not commit ramp space to an operator for the September 8–11 window outside of this process, to maintain an accurate and coordinated capacity picture across the airfield.

8. ATC and CBP Coordination

Approved PPR data will be shared with ATC and CBP to support traffic flow planning and international clearance staffing. Operators requiring CBP clearance (international arrivals) must still separately satisfy standard eAPIS and CBP notification requirements in addition to submitting the DAL PPR request; the PPR confirmation does not substitute for CBP clearance procedures.

9. Non-Compliance

Aircraft arriving at DAL during the effective period without an approved PPR confirmation may be subject to delays, denial of ramp space, or diversion to an alternate airport, at the discretion of DAL Operations and based on available capacity at the time of arrival.
